John is an active member of the Hopkins County Genealogical Society, has served fifteen years on the executive board and is currently the HCGS President. He has presented at the FGS National Conference, NGS Conference, and was an instructor for TIGR, IGHR, Samford University and University of Georgia. John has also been the featured speaker for more than 70 all day seminars located in Texas, Louisiana, Arkansas, New Mexico, and Oklahoma.

WRITING SPECIAL INTEREST GROUP (NEW)



The first gathering of the newly formed BAGS' *Genealogy Writing Special Interest Group* (SIG) met in person on Thursday, 16 January, at Friendswood Public Library. In addition to Rebecca "Becky" Jones, coordinator of the SIG, eight BAGS' members were in attendance, eager to tell a story of their ancestors.

After a short presentation to review hints for starting a project, each individual spent the remainder of the twohour session writing on their project. Becky conducted

one-on-one conversations with each attendee to better understand their expectations for participating in the group. By learning details on the status of each individual's current or future writing project, she plans to tailor future sessions with helpful hints and tips on genealogical writing that are more specifically designed to the group's needs.

Education Spotlight Presentation Fold3 Tuesday, Februay 25th, 1:30-3:30pm Frinedswood Public Library

Fold3 features premier collections of original military records. These records include the stories, photos, and personal documents of the men and women who served in the military. Many of the records come from the U.S. National archives, The National Archives of the U.K. and other international record.

Join BAGS members Kathleen Williams and Fred Roe as they help us learn to access Fold3, navigate through its various records, and the history behind it. Many local libraries provide free remote access to this excellent website — so remember to bring your laptop and your Friendswood Public Library card!

Take advantage of these weeks confined indoors by studying your family's history. Here' a genealogy task for February that will keep you cozy while moving your research forward.

Focus on Marriage Records

With Valentine's Day in mind, make sure you've fully documented all the marriages in your family tree. <u>Marriage certificates</u> often contain information about both the bride and groom and previous generations: names of parents, ancestral birthplaces and (especially) maiden names.

Fortunately, <u>laws for accessing</u> recent marriage records are generally laxer than they are for birth and death records. Non-direct descendants might only have to wait 50 years from the date of a marriage to request records, whereas the restriction may be longer (75 or even 100 years) for birth and death certificates. Marriage records were also generally kept earlier than other vital events, helpful when you're researching in a place with relatively late vital-registration mandates.

Don't think only about marriage certificates and <u>licenses</u>, however. Weddings generated a <u>variety of documents</u>: marriage banns (published in newspapers or by the sponsoring church ahead of the ceremony) or <u>bonds</u> (paid by the groom or his family), for example. Take some time to learn about <u>marriage customs</u> in your ancestor's time, place and culture to see what may be available.

Also look for mementos kept at home, such as:

- Newspaper announcements
- Photo albums
- Wedding attire, especially <u>dresses</u> and bouquets
- Gifts that include the wedding date or name of bride and groom

You likely have an ancestor who married multiple times. Play around with your preferred genealogy software or online family tree to learn <u>how to</u> <u>document blended families</u> and second (or third, or fourth) marriages. ~ *from FamilyTree Magazine*, <u>https://familytreemagazine.com/projects/february-genealogy-activities/</u>
